This course provides an advanced analysis of law and policy covering general insurance. The insurance industry has undergone unprecedented levels of economic and legal reform, as well as rapid convergence with, and sometimes divergence from other financial services. This course studies the insurance industry and its regulation as well as insurance contracts and insurance disputes. It covers both regulation and litigation and covers the mix of case law and statute that makes up contemporary insurance law.

Course outline

Insurance Law provides an advance analysis of law and policy covering general insurance. The course does not cover life insurance or health insurance. The course is divided into three sections:

The insurance industry and its regulation

Topics covered will include an overview of the insurance industry, its products and services. We will look at risk management frameworks, considering the function of insurance contracts in the context of a risk management program. Key concepts such as what it means to 'carry on insurance business' will be covered. We will also study the regulation of insurance, including prudential regulation by ASIC and financial services licensing. Finally, the regulation and law of insurance intermediaries will be covered.

The insurance contract

This part of the course will consider the common law and legislation that constitutes and regulates the terms of an insurance contract. It will analyse the principles of good faith, disclosure and misrepresentation and areas such as contract terms, claims and claims terms. The final session will be an introduction to reinsurance concepts.

Insurance disputes

This part of the course will consider insurance complaints and litigation, including key issues and strategies of insurance litigation.

Classes will combine some lecturing with a mainly seminar discussion format. A set of reading material will be available and students will be expected to have read and considered these in advance.

Legislation and regulation considered will include the Insurance Contracts Act, the Insurance Act 1973 and the Financial Services Reform legislation.

Enrolment Options

Program Format & Assessment

Classes will combine some lecturing with mainly seminar discussion format, based on prepared materials. A set of reading materials will be available and students will be expected to have read and considered these in advance. Assessment includes a research essay and class participation.
