Objectives

These four days are an intensive examination of the Law that governs the mining and resources industries in Australia. This course is intended as a gateway to practice in this area and consequently is practical in its approach.

MCLE participation

The subject matter is divided into four distinct days any of which may be attended by CLE participants where relevant to your practice or career development. CLE enrolment can be completed on this form.

Post Graduate Enrolments

The course is also open to post graduate enrolment in UNSW Law School's LLM or LMS programs. Post graduate enrolment must be undertaken online at the web address www.law.unsw.edu.au (and not on this form)

Course coverage

DAY 1 covers the legislative framework for the exploration and extraction of traditional resources. A comparative examination of the mining Acts from around Australia will be a unique and valuable dimension to this course.

DAY 2 covers financing and fund raising by the mining & resources industry. The entities that control these exploration and mining interests will be examined in respect to funding and commercialisation processes. This includes the role and impact of trade practices issues, taxation, merger and acquisition controls, capital raisings, special joint venture and farm out agreements, and due diligence.

DAY 3 is a review of the emerging rights in relation to more sustainable new energy sources and the environmental law governing of the industry.

A key element in the course is the focus on non-carbon resources and the environmental values and impact of Climate change. Uranium mining processing and export and waste storage issues are also examined.

Wind, waves and sunlight are now sources of energy with a significant potential value. Rights and interests over them are a developing body of law. Thermal technologies and water resources as affected by the resources industry will also be discussed.

Day 4 examines industry contracting, employment law issues and native title. The special relationship of the resources industry to the development of native title is examined in respect to the cultural impact and opportunities that a collaborative approach can produce.

The course introduces you to the nature of the interests secured under the mining and petroleum legislation in Australia, how to advise on financial, corporate, labour, environmental law in the mining industry context as well as examining the future of new energy sources and climate change.
